The Salem-Keizer Cascade Model training program is for behavioral threat assessment (BTA) team members, including school administrators, school psychology professionals, special education coordinators, and school resource officers. This program is also for law enforcement, practitioners from community mental health services, representatives from juvenile services and law enforcement, and other community agencies.

and security and risk management systems consultation. He is recognized internationally as an expert in threat assessment and a pioneer of multi-disciplinary threat assessment.

In 1999, John began the development and implementation of the Salem-Keizer Cascade Model, a multi-agency student violence prevention and behavioral threat assessment system that is considered by experts to be a leading practice and is identified by the U.S. Department of Education and the What Works Clearinghouse as a best-practice program.
